


IMPORTANT DATES

A gentle reminder that the school will be closed tomorrow, Friday 28th June, for teacher training day. School will reopen on Monday 1st July at 08:40 am.




WARWICK UNIVERSITY TRIP

Students from KS3 took part in a creative workshop day at Warwick University as part of Refugee week. The event was organized by the Creative Learning centre and other schools across the city took part. We started the day visiting The Mead Gallery to look at an exhibition called Art without Borders featuring work by Rwandan-Italian artist, Francis Offman, that show his new abstract paintings. His canvases tell stories of friendship and travel. They share tales of journeys from across the globe made with materials that reflect colonialism as well as his own personal experiences growing up in Rwanda and his journey to refuge in Italy after fleeing civil war and genocide in 1994.

The students then took part in a series of creative activities designed to show what home means to them, what would be their messages for other refugee children coming to the UK and a tour of the University Sculpture trail.

The students said that were amazed at how big the University was and how many different people were there, they enjoyed mixing with students from other schools and telling their own refugee stories.
