As well as this, we have had students competing in a range of different sports for the school, from football to rugby, athletics to trampolining. We have had victories and defeats along the way, but one thing that has shone through is the determination and spirit of all of our Year 7s no matter what the outcome; this is an exceptional quality to have, and something we are excited to see students continue to grow as they move forward over the next term.

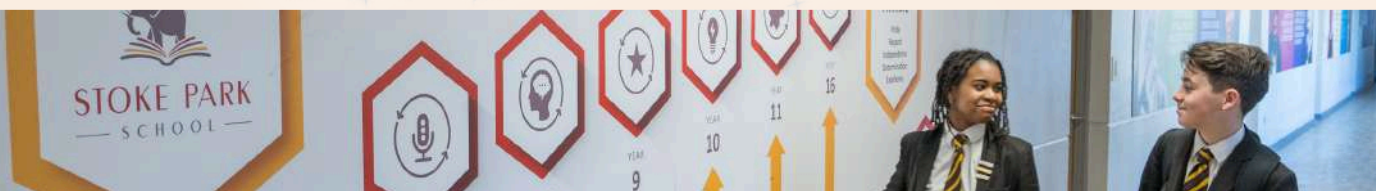

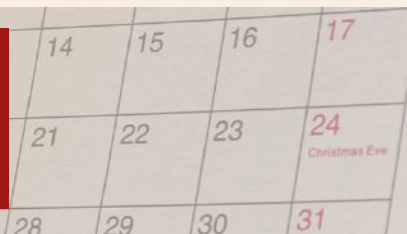

POST 16 - THE SCHOLAR

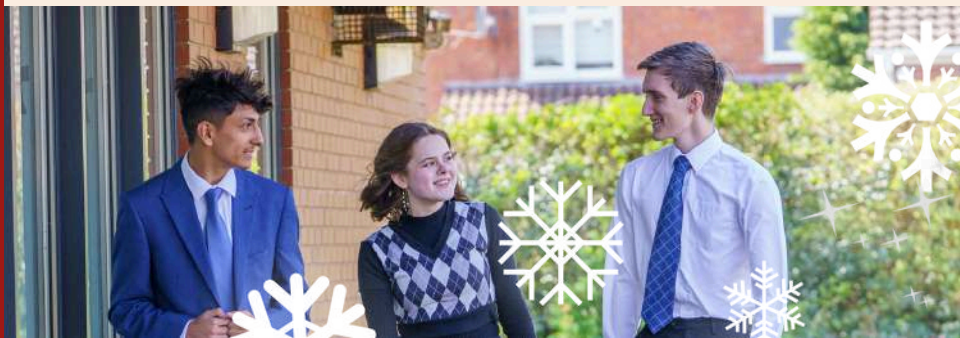

HEARING RESOURCE BASE NEWS

We started our academic year with some fantastic news. Ten pupils received certificates for successfully completing the British Sign Language Level 1 award. Out of the ten pupils, eight of them are now continuing with the Level 2 qualification which is equivalent to a GCSE. We now have a new cohort of seven pupils that will undertake the Level 1 qualification for this academic. As the only secondary school in Coventry and surrounding areas with a Hearing Resource Base for profoundly deaf children, we are immensely proud of all the pupils for not only developing their skillset but also helping to make Stoke Park School a more inclusive school.

Five of our deaf pupils competed in a HADO tournament. If like me you have no idea what HADO is, allow me to explain. HADO is the world's first Augmented Reality (AR) sport that combines physical movement with video game elements. It is like an AR version of dodgeball. Players wear an AR headset and a motion sensor on their wrist in order to target energy balls towards their opponents. The amazing thing about HADO is that it is very inclusive. Size, strength, and athletic ability are not as important as agility and being able to target and use shield elements. Our team did extremely well. The boys showed excellent determination, outstanding teamwork and support for each other and finished in second place overall out of nine teams! A huge congratulations to all them.

Oh yes we did! Our recent trip to the Belgrade Theatre to watch Sleeping Beauty the pantomime was a fantastic success, filled with laughter, colour, and plenty of 'behind you' moments. Eleven pupils, both deaf and hearing, took part in this trip. From the moment the curtain rose, everyone was fully engaged, joining in with the songs, cheering the heroes and booing the baddies. The performance had captions which allowed our deaf pupils to be fully included. Even though it's behind us now...we are still smiling from it!

And finally, it was time for our annual Christmas get together with the staff and pupils from the primary resource base. This was a lovely way to catch up, to celebrate the end of term and to enjoy some festive fun. Pupils had a great time socialising, taking part in Christmas themed games and enjoying snacks together. This trip gave everyone the opportunity to enjoy a change of scenery, share laughs with friends and create special memories together. Our pupils were exceptional ambassadors for the school which helps with the transition from primary to secondary as it is likely that most of the deaf pupils from the primary resource base, will become Stoke Park pupils when they are in Year 7.

Y9 NETBALL WINS

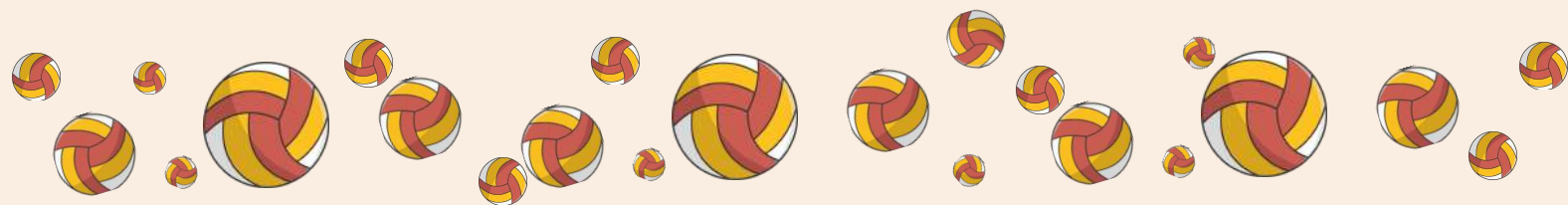

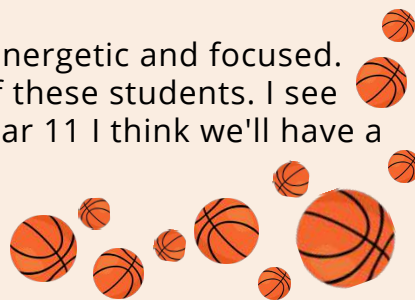


BASKETBALL SPARKS!

Chineke! Orchestra, Europe's first majority Black and ethnically diverse orchestra, delivered a stunning performance that blended classical brilliance with contemporary flair. A particular highlight of the evening was Beethoven's Triple Concerto, featuring three outstanding soloists: Tai Murray (violin), Sheku Kanneh-Mason (cello), and Isata Kanneh-Mason (piano). Their performance was both technically masterful and emotionally powerful, leaving a lasting impression on the audience. For many students, this was their first time experiencing a live orchestral performance.



One student shared, "I didn't know what to expect, but it was amazing. The soloists were incredible, and the whole orchestra played with so much passion." The students' conduct on the evening also drew praise from members of the public. One audience member wrote, "All of the pupils at the concert, without exception, were very polite, well behaved and were a real testimony to themselves, their parents and the school... They conducted themselves impeccably." The same audience member also noted that Stoke Park was the only school present, commending the staff for making such an inspiring opportunity possible.

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT IN MUSICAL THEATRE SINGING

On Monday, 24th November, Kaya D (Year 12) sat her LCM Grade 8 Musical Theatre Singing Exam and achieved an exceptional score of 94 out of 100, earning a Distinction. The London College of Music (LCM) Grade 8 assessment is the highest level in this discipline and is marked across four components: Vocal Exercises, Performance, Performance Delivery & Written Programme, Discussion. A score of 85+ marks is required for a Distinction, making Kaya's result a remarkable accomplishment. This achievement reflects her technical skill, interpretative ability, and deep understanding of musical theatre performance. Importantly, this Grade 8 qualification carries 30 UCAS points, which will significantly support Kaya's progression to higher education and specialist performing arts pathways.
