

PROM ANNOUNCEMENT

We are pleased to announce that the Prom will take place Friday 4th of July 2025. Further details regarding the event and food options will follow. Tickets are expected to costs around £35-40.

As a reward for their hard work and an added incentive, students have an opportunity to earn a discount on their prom ticket, which will be subsidised by the school. To be eligible for a discount students who meet one of the following criteria will be eligible for this discount.

- Any students who have 100 % attendance from 13 of January 2025 until 16th of June 2025, attended all interventions (where applicable) and are on time will get £10 off.
- Any students who have 100 % attendance from September 2024 to the end of the year (16th of June 2025) attended all interventions (where applicable) and are on time will get £15 off.
- Any students that will have 96 % attendance from September 2024 to the end of the year (16th of June 2025) attended all interventions (where applicable) and are on time will get £5 off.
