MOVING ON UP

As we move into this crucial stage of the academic year, our Year 11 students — The Architects — are preparing for their next phase of mock examinations, which begin Monday 17th November. Students have now received their mock exam timetables and should begin revising regularly to consolidate learning and close any remaining gaps.

Parents can support by helping their child stay organised, maintain consistent routines, and revisit weaker topics. Small, daily efforts — supported by attendance at after-school interventions — will make a significant difference as we build towards summer.

We continue to be impressed by the focus, resilience, and maturity shown by The Architects so far this year. Their positive attitude to learning and the example they set to younger students make us extremely proud.

At this stage, attendance and punctuality are essential — every day counts, and full participation in lessons gives every student the best chance to succeed.

ASSEMBLY FOCUS – MARGINAL GAINS
