
This has been such a lovely half term for year 7 with lots of enriching opportunities and experiences to widen students' Stoke Park Experience!

BOOK OF THE WEEK

Selected for this week's Book of the Week, we have the critically acclaimed Divergent, written by Veronica Roth. The Divergent book series is the latest which Stoke Park has added to its Library, due to the over-whelmingly positive reviews alongside a film series and its many similarities to The Hunger Games, another popular book series.

Divergent was originally published in 2011 and has gone on to establish a book series with three more entries. Roth's first installment still remains the best of the bunch and as such has become an award-winning title, with millions of positive reviews and ratings! Divergent was a bestseller throughout 2011 and 2012, making the novel a household name for keen readers.

In Divergent's dystopian Chicago world, society is divided into five factions, each dedicated to the cultivation of a particular virtue—Candor (the honest), Abnegation (the selfless), Dauntless (the brave), Amity (the peaceful), and Erudite (the intelligent).

On an appointed day of every year, all sixteen-year-olds must select the faction to which they will devote the rest of their lives.
