Dear Parent/Carer,

With our final round of Year 11 mocks having come to an end, it is time to share your child's final GCSE mock results. The mock results give a clear indication on what your child would have achieved for the real GCSE exams.

On reflection students should be embodying being 'The Architect' on the 7-Year Journey and moulding themselves into the best versions of themselves, for the best possible results. At this stage of their learning, it is essential students are continually revisiting their key powerful knowledge and applying knowledge to past papers so that they are fully prepared for the final GCSE exams. To maximise your child's life chances we highly recommend they follow their normal school timetable as part of their daily revision during the Easter break. Following their normal school day timetable will allow students time for breaks but also allocate the right amount of study time per subject. It will also keep them in a good routine around sleep. This is an essential part of good mental health. When students stay up late throughout the holiday it often affects their routine and concentration for at least the first week when they return. Furthermore, as your child prepares for their upcoming exams, it is imperative that they maintain a healthy balance between study and relaxation. Following the school timetable for revision will give them the evenings off to relax. Encourage them to schedule regular breaks during their revision sessions and to incorporate rewards for their hard work. These breaks are essential for maintaining focus and motivation, ultimately contributing to their overall well-being and academic success.

We will give students their mock grades on Friday afternoon so please ask to see them when they get home. In addition to your child's mock grades, we will be posting to you over the Easter holidays your child's predicted and target grades. Their target grade is the result they should be achieving by the end of Year 11 whilst the "Predicted Grade" reflects where teachers feel, based upon current work ethos, attendance, results from assessments and where your child will finish at the end of Year 11.

The report will also have other highly pertinent information. This includes their **attendance**, **which should be at 100%**. It is vital that students have this level of attendance, as every single day missed is 5 hours of learning lost. We have 23 school days left to the first set of GCSE exams.

Our Year 11 teachers, and the Year 11-year team, are working tirelessly to ensure that every one of our Architects is fully supported to ensure that they have the most successful outcome possible. We are very proud of our year 11 students and wish them every success for their upcoming GCSE exams.
