Dear Parent/Carer,

As another full and exciting term comes to an end, I would like to take this opportunity to share a number of events that students have been involved in, from awards in the National Mathematics Competition, to a record number of sporting successes.

At the start of March, all students took part in Careers Week. This exciting week of events was carefully planned for students to explore future pathways in a range of subjects. Our students have also visited Eton College, Windsor this term where they have undertaken workshops on resilience, character development and critical thinking.
