Dear Parent/Carer,

We are pleased to invite you and your child to our **Year 11 Information Evening on Thursday 1 October 2026 at Stoke Park School**. This is an important opportunity for us to work together at the start of this crucial year and to ensure that students and families are fully informed about the expectations, support and key milestones ahead.

The same presentation will be delivered twice: **Session 1: 4:15pm-4:45pm** and **Session 2: 5:00pm-5:30pm**.

Parents/carers and students should arrive via **Main Reception, Dane Road**. We strongly encourage students to attend alongside their parent/carers.

During the evening, we will explain the Year 11 programme and the support available, including the first round of mock examinations, subject-specific revision, targeted intervention, independent study, attendance and punctuality, Prom incentives, examination routines and JCQ regulations. We will also explain how families can support students as they prepare for GCSE examinations and their Post-16 pathways.

The first round of mock examinations begins on Monday 12 October 2026. These assessments give students valuable experience of formal examination conditions, allow them to practise examination technique and time management, and help identify strengths and areas for further development. The outcomes will also help teachers target subsequent teaching, intervention and revision.

Student Voice - This Week's Focus

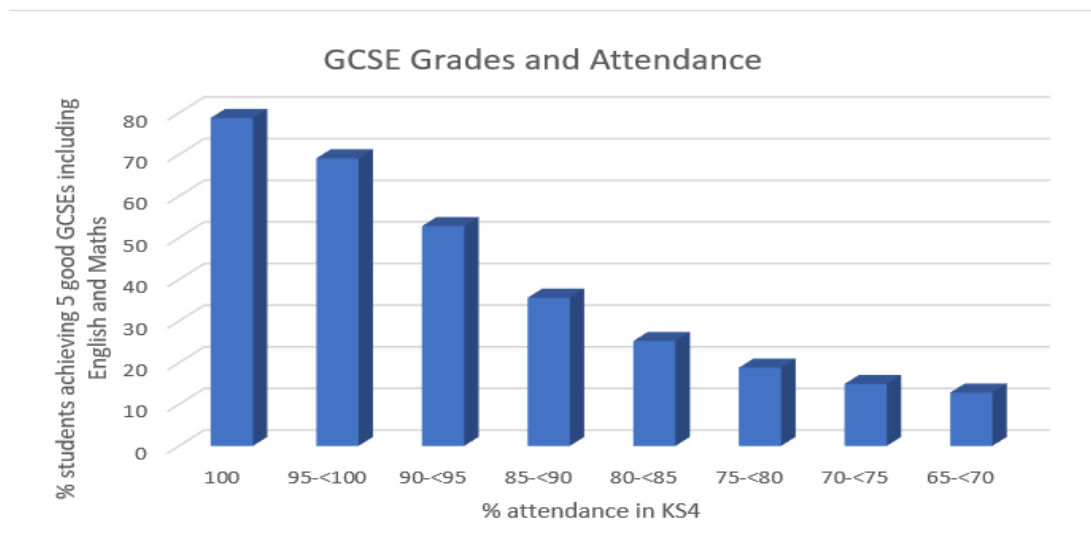
Students have been asked to reflect on their revision habits and exam readiness. We encourage you to follow up at home by asking:

- Are you aware of your target grade?
- What will be tested in your mock exams? What resources are you using to revise?
- What is the main thing you are working on - based on the feedback from your last mocks - to ensure you improve this time?
- How is intervention/independent study supporting you with your mocks and upcoming assessments?

Attendance and Punctuality

Attendance, punctuality and intervention remain central to success in Year 11. Every lesson, every intervention and every day in school counts. Students should attend school consistently, arrive on time, engage fully in lessons and attend all intervention sessions allocated to them.

Alongside attendance, punctuality is equally important. Students must arrive by 8:40am. Targeted interventions take place during morning registration, and any student arriving after this time will be marked as unauthorised.



Rewards and Prom Incentive

We also want to recognise strong commitment. Students who demonstrate good attendance and punctuality, alongside attendance at their allocated intervention sessions, will be treated to a **special prize on Friday 9 October 2026**. In addition, students who maintain at least **95% attendance** during the identified Prom incentive period will receive **£10 off the cost of their Year 11 Prom ticket**.

Examination Expectations

Students must also be fully prepared for examination conditions. They should bring the correct equipment and follow JCQ regulations at all times. The key JCQ expectations are included later in this document so that families can review them together before the mock examinations.

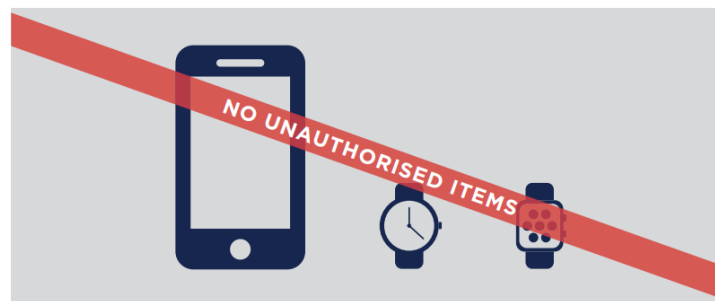
